


# JANE AUSTEN'S HOUSE GROUP VISIT POLICY 2026



Visit Jane Austen's House in the Hampshire village of Chawton and discover the world's best loved novelist. It was in this picturesque cottage that Jane Austen's genius flourished and where she wrote, revised, and had published all six of her globally beloved novels.

Groups can step back in time to 1816 and freely explore the rooms where Jane Austen lived and wrote, from the sunny Drawing Room where she practised the piano every morning, and where she read *Pride and Prejudice* aloud to a neighbour on the very day she received her first copy, to the vibrant green Dining Room where she wrote.



Groups can discover an unparalleled collection of Austen treasures including Jane's jewellery, letters, first editions of her novels and the tiny table where she wrote. The pretty garden is a perfect place to relax after your visit and the Gift Shop stocks a unique range of gifts and books.


Each group is welcomed by a staff member and given a brief introduction to Jane Austen's home. We can't wait to welcome you!

## BOOKING CONDITIONS:

- Group rates are applicable to groups of 20+
- All groups must be booked and paid for in advance, please contact us for date availability: [enquiries@janeaustens.house](mailto:enquiries@janeaustens.house)
- A non-refundable £100 deposit is payable in advance, together with a completed booking form to secure your requested date. Please note that your booking is not confirmed until the deposit is received.
- We require final numbers and the balance payment 14 days prior to the visit.
- One group leader may enter for free.
- We only allow one group in the AM (from 10am arrival) and one PM (from 1.30pm arrival)
- Group visits are self-guided with knowledgeable room stewards on hand to help and answer your questions.
- Group tickets are not annual passes.
- **We are unable to accept any group bookings from 23 July 2026 to 31 August 2026**

## GROUP BOOKING BENEFITS:

- Each group is welcomed by a staff member and given a brief introduction to Jane Austen's House.
- One group leader may enter for free.



- The 2026 group ticket price is discounted compared to standard tickets purchased in the shop on the day of the visit.
- Upon receipt of the non-refundable deposit, slots are booked for the group.

## PRICES:


- Groups are classed as 20 + with one group leader receiving free entry.
- 2026 GROUP RATE - £14.00 per person

## CANCELLATION POLICY:

- Please note that the £100 deposit fee is non-refundable. **Payment of the final balance must be made at least 14 days prior to the visit, or your booking will be cancelled.**
- Cancellations made on the day of visit, or 'no-shows' will not be entitled to a refund.

## MAKING A BOOKING:

- When availability is confirmed, we will ask you to complete and return a booking form within 14 days, together with a deposit of £100, to secure the date. Your booking is not confirmed until the deposit is received.
- **Payment of the final balance must be made at least 14 days prior to the visit** via credit/debit card (via phone) or BACS transfer. If payment is not made within this time, we will unfortunately have to cancel your booking.

## ACCESS & FACILITIES:


Jane Austen's House is a historic property with low doorways and uneven surfaces underfoot. The ground floor and outbuildings are fully accessible, and we have an accessible WC with baby changing facilities. Unfortunately, the upstairs of the main house is currently only accessible by climbing a historic wooden staircase although the upstairs can now be viewed virtually via the 360° virtual tour on our website. Assistance dogs are welcome throughout the House.

The Museum does not have any catering facilities on site. For refreshments in the village there are three options: Cassandra's Cup and The Greyfriar Pub (both directly opposite the House) and Chawton House which is ten minutes' walk away. Advance booking is required for groups wishing to visit these venues - please see their websites for details.

Jane Austen's House is located in the rural village of Chawton, near the town of Alton in Hampshire, and accessed via the A31/A32. Parking is available in the public car park opposite the House, beyond the pub car park. There are two allocated coach bays within the village car park. Please avoid parking on the roads whenever possible. We ask that you respect our neighbours and do not block entrances or leave engines running unnecessarily.
